ELC is a successful, traditional language school which is well-respected by its staff and students.

Since the previous inspection the staff have worked extremely hard to bring systems and documentation in line with the requirements of the ABLS standard especially in the key areas of academic management and welfare. They have done this without losing the individual attention to students' needs.
