Statement for Publication

Holy Child school continues to provide a happy, safe and welcoming environment for students.

The school and grounds were generally in reasonable condition and a decorating programme is ongoing. The buildings that had been decorated were clean and fresh. The accommodation blocks had benefitted greatly from decorative work carried out in the Spring. The task of maintaining the buildings at Holy Child clearly represents an ever-present challenge to the College.

The approach to welfare is strong at Holy Child and is a key feature of the College. The continued use of monitors adds a highly effective level of welfare support. The training of the three principals to at least Safeguarding Level Two is a positive move and shows a continued commitment to the welfare and well-being of their students.
